A WORD FROM SENIOR PASTOR JON RHODES

I am the vine, you are the branches. Those who abide in me and I in them bear much fruit, because apart from me you can do nothing. (John 15:5)

People of Christiania,

Throughout my childhood and into my young adult life, one thing remained true: I loved camp. I loved everything about it: camp friends; camp responsibilities; camp activities; camp memories; and the physical place. Camp was one of the first places I was gifted with responsibility and if there was one place in the world I felt most at home—it was camp. Looking back, I remember camp giving me a way of understanding life, meaning, purpose, and even faith.

What was it that made camp so special? Camp showed me how to be a person of faith and, more importantly, camp showed me how to trust God and be in relationship with God. For a long time, I had great certainty: God was present at camp. Later I came to understand God was truly everywhere but camp was the place I was most intentional in God's ways.

At camp, our daily routines included morning prayer and devotions, mealtime prayers, bible study, playing together, learning together, and just before "lights out" we were led in devotions by our high school counselor. At its best, church is the same as camp—it is an opportunity to be in trusting relationship with God and one another.

In creation God speaks everything into being and brings connection and wholeness to all parts of creation. Out of love God gives his Son, and in Christ's life and ministry we see what deep, trusting relationships look like. Jesus reminds those trusting of him that we are branches attached to him—the vine (John 15). How do you live in community? How do you live in relationship?

One thing I have always appreciated about life together as the church, is the intentionality in which we try to live. Jesus teaches, we learn and follow. Jesus teaches the Great Commandment (Matthew 22:36-40): "**Teacher, which commandment in the law is the greatest?**" He said to him, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the greatest and first commandment. And a second is like it: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' On these two commandments hang all the law and the prophets." To live this, then, is to put loving God and loving people first; even in front of taking care of our own needs.

Likewise, Jesus shares the Great Commission (Matthew 28:16-20) with the disciples: **And Jesus came and said to them, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age."** Jesus shares with those who learn and live it out.

As people of the Great Commandment and the Great Commission, we seek to live as the body of Christ in the world: deeply connected and trusting with one another and deeply connected and trusting of Christ. As people of the Pentecost, we trust in God's Holy Spirit to empower what is next.

Our mission statement has served us well over the years: **We start with CHRIST in our SERVING, in our CARING, in our GROWING.** In it I see a strong agricultural allusion which fits Christiania so well. We are planted in a farming community and the action of our lives (serving/caring/growing) is always centered in Jesus Christ.

Some of us have been wondering, what is next for Christiania? What is our vision for being community? What does it mean to be Christ's church in 2021? After more than a year of pandemic, the past weeks have been joy-filled as many among us have been returning to the practices of faith and relationship that serve us and God so well. Each week we have experienced homecoming joy as people who have been limiting exposure return physically to the community.

Friends, in the coming months where we are headed will become clear. Join me in praying for and about God's plans for Christiania. It seems to me one of our primary focal points ought to be reconnecting with God's people. So many have been disconnected. In fact, long before pandemic many had fallen away from our worship community and ministries. We have much work ahead of us as we work to intentionally reconnect with our people. We are interested in restarting our membership committee so they can help us reconnect with Christiania members and friends.

A couple things we can do prior to the formal visioning and committee-building is to be in prayer and discernment of God's will for us. Also, reach out to those you have not seen or heard from: by phone, letter, email, or even a visit. I can't wait to see what God has in store for us.

God loves you and so do I!

EXECUTIVE COUNCIL PRESIDENT BRUCE MOHN

Erica Jorgensen has been the go-to person managing the check-in station for church. Thank you Daniel and Erica for your extra effort in serving our church.

AN UPDATE FROM THE COVID RESPONSE TEAM

Since March of 2020, the COVID Response Team — a group of medical professionals, educators, staff, and volunteers — has been working to develop and update COVID-related policies for the Christiania community. The basis for these policy recommendations comes from CDC, MN Department of Health, and local medical and school district guidelines. This team continues to meet bi-weekly to discuss and review any changes in those guidelines, to update church policy recommendations, and to evaluate how those policies impact specific upcoming events.

Much has happened since last months newsletter; much of what we've all longed for has happened:

- we've added more singing to worship;
- we no longer ask for reservations;
- Minnesota's mask mandate has ended;
- we have had a couple weeks of bring your own coffee with coffee hour returning in June.

Our team will continue to meet regularly as we continue to engage in practices recommended by the CDC and the Stay Safe MN guidelines. These practices include staying home when experiencing symptoms and engaging in good hygiene practices and regular cleaning/disinfecting of our facility. These actions remain critical to our ability to protect our congregation, staff and community. Our number one goal is to safely remain open to continue our ministries. Thank you for your help, patience and support as we continue to be God's church.

IMPORTANT MESSAGE FROM YOUR CEMETERY COMMITTEE

On May 4, the Cemetery Committee met and discussed the idea of purchasing a Columbarium for our Church. A Columbarium is a permanent structure designed as a final resting place to house cremated remains. It has individual niches for urns. Conversations on a Columbarium have taken place with several members of our congregation and at previous Cemetery meetings. Highview Christiania installed a columbarium in 2016 on the south side of their church, just north of the cemetery.

Committee members have had conversations with members from Highview Christiania regarding the cost of their columbarium and the cost savings to their members. Purchasing a niche as an eternal resting place eliminates the costs for a plot of land and a stone monument.

We have gotten proposals from several companies that manufacture and install Columbariums. Working with the estimates received and information from Highview Christiania, we estimate a niche for a member of our congregation would be approximately \$1,100 - \$1,600 (depending on single or double niche). There would also be a \$250 charge for a name plate and an opening fee.

If the decision were made to move forward with the purchase of a Columbarium, we would need to pre-sell approximately half of the niches prior to placing an order.

The Committee discussed which cemetery would be home to the Columbarium if we did decide to purchase one. A permanent place for the Columbarium will be decided later. Soil samples need to be taken to determine an adequate site.

We need **your** input so a Congregational decision can be made on whether to move forward or not.

A word from our Director of Faith Formation

Two years ago I took a step down a path that I had thought about multiple times over the past 20 years or so; I enrolled at Luther Seminary to pursue my call to become an ordained minister. This part of my faith journey is due in no small part to the support and encouragement I have received from the people of Christiania. Many have asked where I'm at on my seminary journey, so I thought I would use this space to give a quick update.

As of May 28, I have completed my second full year of coursework at Luther. This year's courses covered early Christian church history, Luther's Confessions, Old Testament prophetic texts, introductory level Greek, and congregational care and mission. Like so many of our students, my classes were done entirely online. It was a grind toward the end, but worthwhile nonetheless.

Now that summer has arrived I will take a brief pause from classes in order to focus on Vacation Bible School, the youth mission trip, and to make plans for the return of our education programs in the fall.

Looking ahead, I have two more years of classes to take before starting an internship. I anticipate graduating from Luther Seminary in the spring of 2024, and entering the call process to find the church that I will serve as pastor.

It has been a great ride so far, and I expect it will continue to be. None of this would be possible if not for the support of this congregation. Thank you for the kind and encouraging words, prayers, and financial gifts that have helped and sustained me through this seminary journey.
