FROM SENIOR PASTOR JON RHODES

So if anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation: everything old has passed away; see, everything has become new! (2) Corinthians 5:17)

Happy New Year people of Christiania!

I'm still celebrating Christmas and what a glorious celebration it was. In Christ's birth our messiah, who is light, illumines a dark world. The gospel of John reminds us, The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it (John 1:5).

Remembering Christmas isn't a two day event but, rather, a celebration of twelve days keeps me from moving too soon to what's next. The Twelve Days of do not fear, for I am with you, Christmas marks the time between the birth of Christ and the coming of the Magi (the wise men); beginning Dec. 25 (Christmas) and running through Jan. 6 (Epiphany).

So many things were different this year, often including online components for church, family gatherings, and shopping. Change has provided recurring opportunities to practice flexibility with one another and trust in God's provision.

In this year's telling of the nativity story I was cognizant of how often the command "Do not be afraid" was shared by the angels directing God's work. In the gospel of Luke we hear the angel Gabriel sharing God's plans for her life and offering this encouragement to Mary: "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God...(Luke 1:30)."

Matthew's gospel shares a similar word from an angel to Joseph: "...do not be afraid to take Mary as your wife, for the child conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. She will bear a son, and you are to name him Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins" (Matthew 20b-21).

The angels begin with, "Do not be afraid," then share God's plans with both Mary and Joseph. Isn't this a word we need now—a word, perhaps, for 2021? Do not be afraid. I'm thinking a conversation with an angel might be a bit disruptive. I hope I'd be open to it and know the word was of God. But I really believe that Do not be afraid is the word we need to hear today. There is plenty to be afraid of in

the world: COVID-19; cancer; a poor economy; poorly performing investments; lack of savings; a health crisis; death; financial ruin; loss of a job/ relationship; loss of safety; not getting what we deserve; loss of security; food insecurity; being made a fool of; crime committed against us; ID theft; violence; and even someone treating us poorly/ wrongly.

Really, the list is endless—there is plenty to be afraid of-but God has provided a new way; a safe path in the midst of danger. Jesus Christ, the messiah, is our safe path. The one for whom we've been waiting.

The Bible has a lot to say about fear. Basically, it describes two paths: the path of fear and the path of trust. God is the solution to the problem of fear. Here are a couple of the Bible's powerful proclamations against fear:

do not be afraid, for I am your God: I will strengthen you, I will help you, I will uphold you with my victorious right hand. (Isaiah 41:10)

"Do not be afraid; I am the first and the last, and the living one. I was dead, and see, I am alive forever and ever..."

(Revelation 1:17b-18a)

One of my favorite hymns is a simple one we always sang to close each camp chapel service. Written by poet, Annie Johnson Flint (1866-1932), "I Will Not Be Afraid," was a confident expression of faithful living. Evidently, author Flint was burdened deeply with physical challenges including painful arthritis. It appears suffering brought her into a deep and abiding relationship with God. Here is the simple verse we sang as we departed worship:

I will not be afraid; I will not be afraid; I will look upward, And travel onward, And not be afraid.

God is, indeed, doing a new thing. These lyrics express a good and right approach to the dangers we are confronted by. I will not be afraid, friends, and I hope you'll join me in drawing into deeper love and trust of our newborn king, Jesus Christ.

God loves you and so do !!

My year as Executive Council President is coming to an end. To say the least, the past year was not what I or anyone else expected it would be. In early March, the pandemic required us to completely close the church with no advance notice. The Executive Council held their regular monthly meeting on Tuesday, December 8, 2020. At the meeting, the Council did not recommend any formal changes to the COVID-19 Response Plan. Council members also heard a report from the Nominating Committee. The Council reserved most of the meeting to review the church finances for 2020 and discuss the budget for 2021. The 2021 budget will be approved at the January Executive Council Meeting and at the January 31, 2021 Annual Meeting.

QUILT TYING PASS IT ON QUILTS

Attention: Quilters and anyone willing to help fulfil this need.

The quilting group is going progressive. That means we will be doing the different steps of construction at home and passing the quilt on for someone else to do the next step. There are basically four steps and only the last step requires sewing by machine. You can do this!

Step 1 – Layering the backing, batting and top together with fastening with yarn. This takes a large space and a quilt frame or large work surface.

Step 2 – Cutting the yarn and tying it in square knots.

Step 3 – Pinning the edges for the finishing step.

Step 4 – Sewing the edges by machine.

We hope to return to quilting at church but passing the quilts on for different jobs will allow more people to help in the production. The tops measure about 60"x80". Our tops are donated by members or friends of the church. Thrivent has provided funds for batting and thread. All materials will be provided. If you would like to help, please call Linda Otto (952-469-8561) or Sharon Buckley (612-581-5739). Let us know how you want to help. The CLCW quilts go to local shelters and Project Joy in Northfield. In the past, we made 36 – 40 quilts a year. Let's keep or exceed that number in spite of the gathering restrictions.


A word from our Director of Faith Formation Joe Jorgensen


