***“See that none of you repays evil for evil, but always seek to do good to one another and to all. Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you.”
(1 Thessalonians 5:15-18)***

In his letter to the Philippians, the Apostle Paul offers wisdom and encouragement. It's striking to remember that Paul, as a leader of the Christian community, is in great danger and writing from prison. And Paul is expressing joy and thankfulness: ***I thank my God every time I remember you, constantly praying with joy in every one of my prayers for all of you, because of your sharing in the gospel from the first day until now. (Philippians 1:3-5)*** Paul wasn't focused on the particulars of his situation like being in prison or his life being in danger. He wasn't asking for supporters to get him out of his situation. Paul trusts God enough to assume God has put him right where God needs him.

We were also right where God needed us to be when we gathered Friday, Saturday, and Sunday last weekend in Christmas Worship (Eve, Day, and the First Sunday of). It was a joy to be back together inside the sanctuary as we worshiped in the parking lot last Christmas. I heard from so many of you who worshiped this year, both in person and online, expressing joy and thanksgiving for how beautiful the sanctuary looked and how meaningful worship was. Both are only possible with the work of a huge team from the Christiania family. Thank you all who shared your talents and time to bring joy and memorable worship: decorators, musicians, singers, readers, ushers, servers, cleaner-uppers, and streamers.

I find myself joyful and thankful for so many things this year. A special thank you to our Christiania staff who set the tone and begin our preparations: thank you Carri, Cliff, Joe, Lisa and Dr. Matt for your great and helpful work. Thankful for the many thoughtful cards and gifts. Thankful for a loving and loyal family. Thankful for accepting and committed friends. Thankful for great partners in ministry. Thankful for Christ our Emmanuel (God with us).

Christmas is not merely a day or a single event but, rather, a way of living and being. The Christmas season continues through Epiphany (Thursday, January 6) when we remember the coming of the Magi, or three wisemen to the infant Jesus. In Epiphany's first Sunday we celebrate Christ's Baptism, followed by six more weeks of Epiphany. After that we move through Lent, Holy Week, and then Easter.

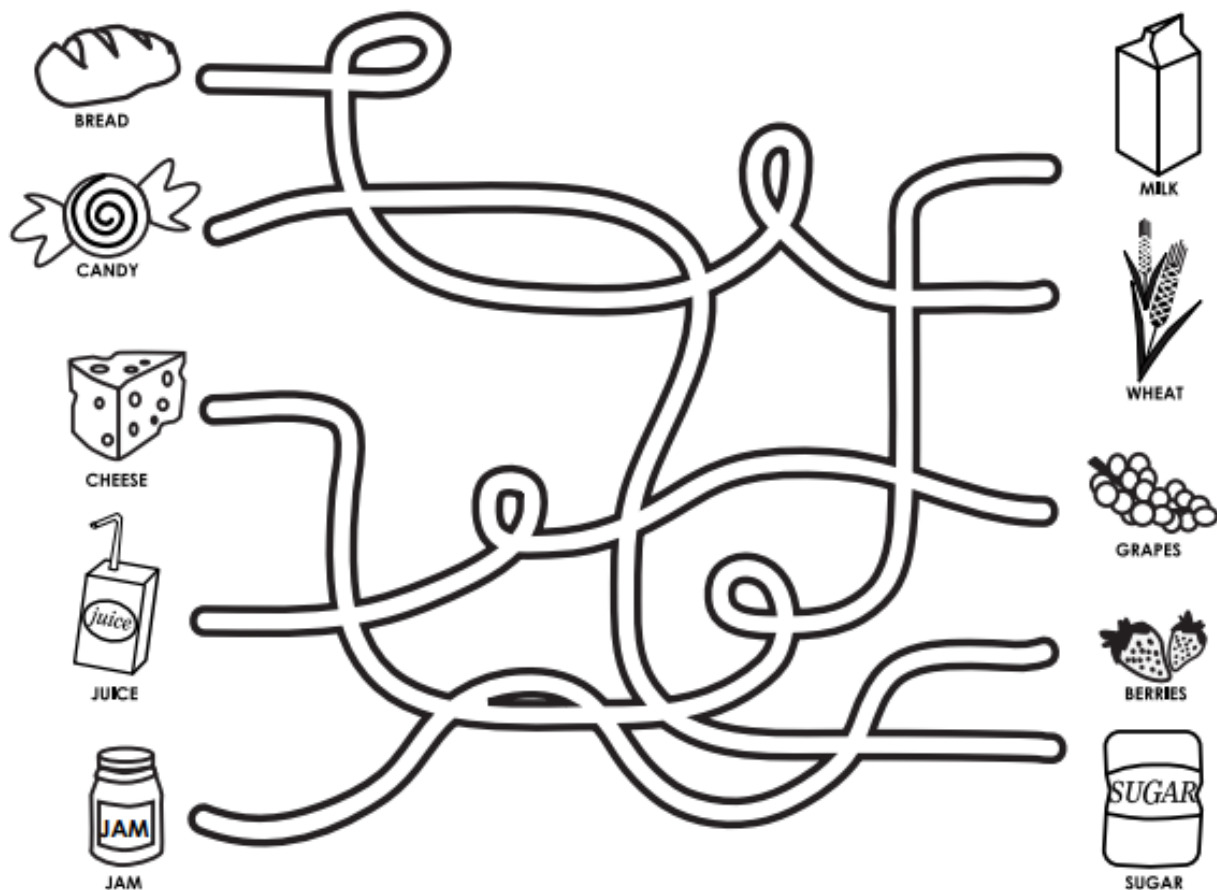
This month we get to hear about the start of Jesus' ministry. Jesus also helps learn and grow. What are some things you want to start this year so that you can learn and grow closer to God?
