“And let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, to which indeed you were called in the one body. And be thankful.” (Colossians 3:15)

People of Christiania,

I've been drawing into the idea of thankfulness a lot these days. Author Germany Kent expressed my own thoughts pretty well: "It's a funny thing about life, once you begin to take note of the things you are grateful for, you begin to lose sight of the things that you lack."

Holy Scripture also has much to say about thankfulness. Colossians 3:15-17 reads: *“And let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, to which indeed you were called in the one body. And be thankful. Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly; teach and admonish one another in all wisdom; and with gratitude in your hearts sing psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs to God. And whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him.”*

There is, indeed, so much to be thankful for as we enter the fall—and not because everything is perfect. One of the things I'm thankful for is the relationship and work we all share in Christ Jesus. You have been so faithful in your support, serving, and showing up. I am also thankful for the faithful work of our Church Council. You have provided great leadership during trying times. So too I am thankful for our COVID advisory team in their work on behalf of Christiania during this past year-and-a-half of pandemic. They have been dependable, wise, open to a variety of ideas, committed to bringing us back together and keeping the people of Christiania safe. Early in the team's initial conversations they decided what we would pay attention to and kept returning to that initial vision. It has served us well and for it I am thankful. Following consistent guidelines has permitted us to return to indoor worship and other ministries relatively quickly. Following a set of principles has helped us navigate differences of opinion and some disagreements.

As you may remember, the sources of information and guidance they've been using include:

- local County numbers (Scott, Dakota, and Rice):
- Minnesota Department of Health (MDH) guidelines,
- The Centers for Disease Control (CDC) guidelines,
- local school districts (Lakeville, Farmington, New Prague, and Northfield).

In addition, the COVID team learned that some of the most important details to pay attention to are the spaces/rooms in which groups are gathering, as well as the duration of the gathering and the proximity of participants.

A WORD FROM PASTOR (continued from page 1)

The above approach has served Christiania well since pausing in-person worship and going online for a couple months in April and May of 2020. This approach has served us well since we started meeting outdoors in the parking lot in June 2020. This approach has served us well when we moved inside the building for worship in July of 2020. Our meeting face-to-face was well ahead of many churches. And we were safe. I believe, this approach will serve us well as we enter the fall ministry season; particularly as we gather students for Sunday School, Confirmation, and Faith Alive.

In line with their consistent approach and use of the various guides above, we have committed to students and teachers wearing masks while gathering together this fall. What I've heard in the COVID team's discussion is multi-faceted: alignment with majority of school districts; alignment with inability to distance in smaller spaces; infection rates in our county and surrounding counties; and the inability of those under 12 to be vaccinated. It's important to remember, although we may be disappointed in the circumstances, the decision to require masks was not due to a lack of education, a lack of understanding, or a lack of considering a wide variety of opinions. In fact, I've seen just the opposite. Please know this decision makes sense in the circumstances and seems to follow how Christiania has been navigating all along. Together we will move forward.

Friends, we are not yet clear of this pandemic yet. Some suggest the pandemic is transitioning to endemic and suggest we'll be living with it going forward like the flu. It would serve us well to find a place of thankfulness and remember that although I or we may be inclined toward a host of different individual decisions or opinions, the church as the body of Christ is trying to move together in concert with one another. At the end of the day, we are Christ's church we can choose whether to move forward together as individuals or as family.

Our COVID team has been doing faithful work in complex and ever-changing circumstances. We should expect they will continue to meet and advise our Church Council while paying attention to and relying upon the same (above) listed information sources and guidance. *"When I remember you in my prayers, I always thank my God."* (Philemon 1:4) Thank you, team, for the work you've done as well as the work you have yet to do. I am so thankful for your big commitment of time and energy as well as your love of God, and your love of Christiania.

Friends, I look forward to a time when we don't have to worry about these details. But today is not that day. *"Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you."* (1 Thessalonians 5:16-18)

As I am writing this letter in the first week of fall, the temperatures will be in the sixties for a few days. The corn and soybeans and some of the trees are turning color. It has the feel and smell of fall!

I want to thank everyone who helped work and plan the “God’s work. Our hands.” on Sunday, September 12. We also had a great Rally Day on Sunday the 19th. There was much to do and see with the farm animals on display, face painting and an old standard fishing for prizes which is something I remember doing at a family night when I was in Sunday School! Thank you to all of the helpers for this event too.

A new twist will be partnering with Highview Christiania Church with Sunday School programming on Wednesdays at our church. There were some families from Highview that came to register and to help with the Rally Day events. Joe Jorgensen has been doing a lot of the coordinating between the two church communities. Thank you for your willingness to move this opportunity forward. Alongside Joe is Alyssa Jorgensen who assists in many ways. Your extra effort is much appreciated.

The generosity of people to share the blessings of God can make a big difference on the outcome of how we can improve our church building. An example of this is way back in May after a State of the Church Address one of the topics was the need to replace one air conditioner unit and add one new one for the Heritage Room and nursery. After the church service a member came up to me and said, “I would like to help financially with this expense.” It was wonderful to hear that someone would be willing to make such a generous contribution. Fast forward to the last week of August, we needed to get three bids to do this project. I asked Josh Carlson, our refresh project contractor if he could help find two more bids. When the bids were in one bid was much less than the others. After doing some homework and calling each of the HVAC companies to review their quotes and that we were comparing like units and options for the job, I asked the lowest company why they were substantially lower. The answer was something I was not expecting. He was willing to help our church out with a lower cost because of the important work churches do and that he attends one as well! With these offers of generosity we can soon enjoy the benefit of better cooling and heating for years to come. With some memorial money to cover the remaining costs, we are blessed to be able to move forward and complete this project!

- *Approved HVAC bid to Mechanical Air Systems, Inc. for two 5 ton roof top HVAC units and electrical work to be done by Tuma Electric

Christiania has much to be thankful for going into fall. On October 17 the State of the Church will give updates on our financial status, the Planting Hope Campaign from the Saint. Paul Area Synod, property projects and other items.

One of the best gifts you can offer the church is volunteering to help in any area. At the end of the day, you can feel you made a difference in someone’s life.

OCTOBER 2021 PROPERTY



HVAC System - The church recently went out for bids for replacement of a ground HVAC unit and a purchase of an additional HVAC unit for the Heritage Room. Three bids were received. At their meeting on September 14, the Church Council approved a contract with Mechanical Air Systems for these two units with an upgrade from Carrier units to Daikin units with a 5-year warranty. With the inclusion of a Nursery vent option and electrical work, the total cost is approximately \$47,500. Work could start as soon as the middle of October.

A donation of \$42,000 for the HVAC System upgrade was received from a congregational couple. Thank you!!!

Outdoor Lighting – Property Chair Brad Smith is discussing upgrading the outdoor and parking lot lights with one of our electrical contractors. More on that later.

Update on pitched roof over the Sanctuary – A claim was sent to Church Mutual for hail damage in June. The amount of damage was \$34,000. Church Mutual already sent 50% of the damage (\$17,000). The understanding is that the other \$17,000, less a deductible of \$2,000, will be sent after the repairs have been made within a year.

This pitched roof has never been insulated. During the suggested replacement, it will be insulated. This will cost more than the insurance amount.

It is hoped, that during the roof work, the large HVAC systems on the north side of the roof can possibly be relocated to a more unnoticeable area. In July 2020, Eric Magin, our roofing contractor, provided us with a bid of \$48,250 for repair and insulation of the pitched roof. Bruce Mohn will check with Eric and see if he will honor this bid (understanding how prices have gone up this last year).

It is assumed that the Council will go for a Capital Campaign to raise the funds needed over the \$32,000 from Church Mutual for the roof repair. This should all happen in 2022.

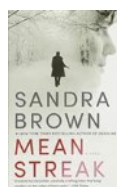

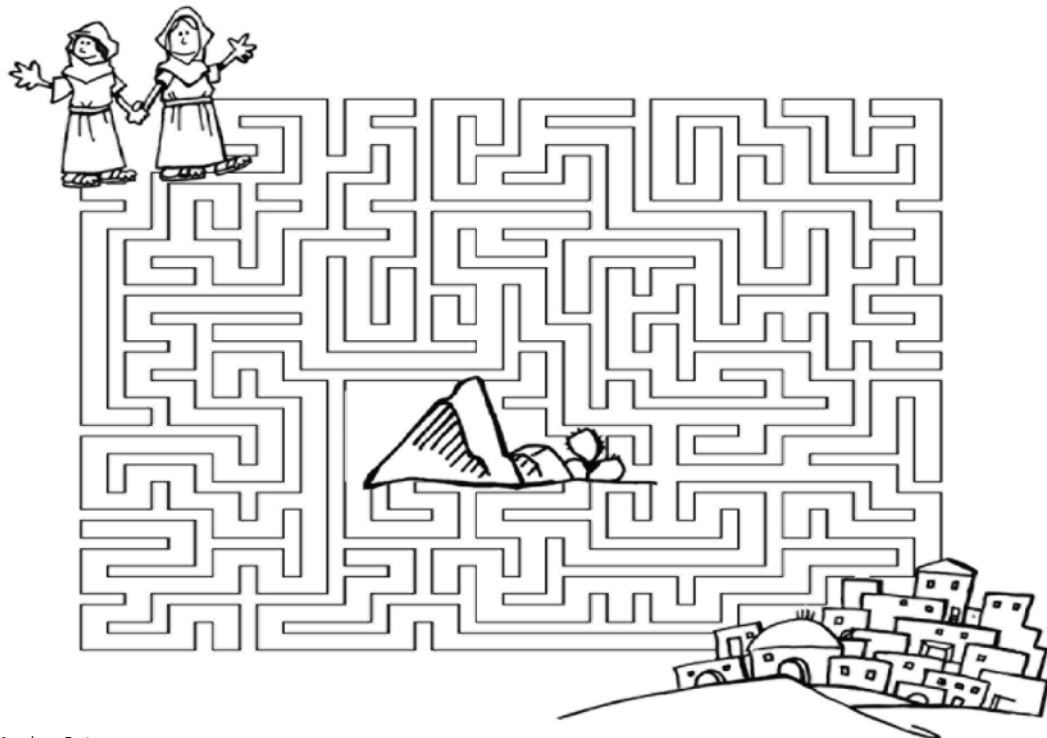
