## From Council President Bill Kanfield

Like many of you, I cannot believe it is the beginning of September already. I've had a great summer but there is so much more to do. Hmmmm, seems like a familiar theme, and one I will translate back to work here at Christiania!

**Finances.** The Financial Review Committee and the audit team have been doing a remarkable job getting caught up after COVID and the mid-flight departure of the treasurer. Using the newly defined and documented policy, procedures and instructions, the audit team has completed their reviews of 2021 and are almost caught up to July 2022. While they have some findings, they are procedural and correctable with no findings of financial impropriety. However, getting a treasurer in to review the financial statements will be a big help in forecasting for the remainder of the year. On that note, we do have a potential candidate to meet with – good news – but do not let that stop you from recommending someone if you know of any interest.

**Property Sales.** Bruce Mohn, Bobby Johnson and members of the property team have been working hard to get the proper paperwork/procedures in order as well as reading the properties themselves. The parsonage especially is showing much work to be done. The group has acted on a recommendation to re-balance both properties to around 3 acres each to allow for animal rights on the property; these rights typically start at 3 acres, and now both properties can have horses or other animals. Thank you all – especially Bobby – for providing your services to the Christiania to move this forward. I think we all feel getting out of the landlord business and applying the financial proceeds to the Refresh effort is the right the thing to do. Per the theme... more to do.


**Shuttle bus.** You may have noticed a shuttle bus in the parking lot. The bus is in the process of being donated to Christiania to be used for church events, activities, outreach and of course youth activities. These kits will then be available for anyone to take and hand out wherever you see the need.



## PROPERTY COMMITTEE



### Church Lots for Sale

On August 1, the tenants of the parsonage house moved out. We appreciate the seven years that they were our tenants. They did a nice job of caring for the property. On August 2, Bruce Mohn and Bill Kanfield went to Eureka Planning Commission meeting to get preliminary approval for the lot splits for the farm property. The survey was completed in late July. There are two lots containing 3.22 acres and the balance of 72.47 acres is left in the farm.

August 8 Bruce and Bill went to the Eureka Township meeting and received final approval for the new lot splits. The next step was to get them recorded at the Dakota County Government Center which is now pending completion.

The final step will be to transition the building right from the east 40 acres into the new 3.22 acre lot in the west 40 acres. When this formality is done, the church farm will have two house sites, the old parsonage one and the new house lot both in the west 40 acres. The plan is to have this done by mid-September.

With the parsonage house vacant, the general cleanup of the lot has been completed. Some trees, bushes and fencing around the garden have been removed as well as the chicken coop. The basement and the garage needed a general cleaning so that was done. An area by the garage was cleared to allow for the inspection of the septic tank. The lawn and outer areas have been mowed. We want to thank Bruce Mohn, Greg Silus, Jack Eckdahl, Bruce Lundeen and Danny Thompson for helping in the clean-up, Bob Fredrickson for fixing the downspouts, Brent Mohn for removing the chicken coop and Greg Silus for mowing.

The next step is to determine the market value for the parsonage house lot and the new lot with the building right. The goal is to have this done by mid-September and get the properties up for sale. So far so good!

### Progress on Refresh Construction Project

Roof - We met with Sela and are still waiting for a bid for metal roofing. We have contacted another roof contractor and will get pricing from him to compare. We have some samples and will evaluate the options and see if we like the "look" of steel and continue to research if it is feasible price wise.

Pews - They should be ordered in September for spring delivery. We will be looking at the layout in late August to determine spacing for more handicap accessible spots.

Flooring - The flooring company came and re-measured the area so the carpeting and luxury vinyl tile can get ordered in September also.

Funding - The funds for the Refresh Project have been coming in. We will soon have a chart showing two columns. One for the pledges and one for the amount received. As of 8/18/2022 the pledges were for \$535,869 and the amount received for those pledges was \$271,893. Continue to fulfill your pledges so the money will be there as it is needed.

These figures do not include: \$250,000 gift, \$32,000 for roof insurance, \$30,000 from the CLC Foundation and \$15,000 in memorials and non-pledged money which is \$5,558.

## MESSAGE FROM THE CHRISTIANIA LUTHERAN CHURCH FOUNDATION

The Foundation Board consists of: Larry Thompson (President), Julie Fish (Treasurer), Warren Peterson (secretary), Barb Bachman, Christian Donovan, Daryl Rieck, Pastor Jon Rhodes and Congregation Council President Bill Kanfield.

The various foundation funds can appear a little complicated so here is a quick “refresher course” about these funds. It is important to understand how the fund’s assets are used to ensure your gifts can be utilized as you want them to. The Foundation Board approves ALL disbursements of fund assets.

**ENDOWMENT FUND:** Funds are to be used for Program Enhancements, Education and Leadership Development, Youth Activity Support, Capital Improvements and Outreach. NOTE: there are restrictions in the bylaws regarding the amount of fund assets that can be annually used (Maximum up to 4%).

**CEMETERY FUND:** Funds are to be used for the care, upkeep and improvements to the church cemeteries. NOTE: there are restrictions in the bylaws regarding the amount of fund assets that can be annually used (Maximum up to 4%).

**SPECIAL PURPOSE FUND:** Funds are to be used for special purposes as determined by the foundation board. NOTE: there are NO restrictions regarding the use of these funds. For example, the foundation’s contribution to the Refresh project came from the Special Purpose fund.

If you are considering or planning a gift to the Foundation, please be careful if making out a check, as the Foundation and Christiania Church have separate funds. Make checks on the pay to order line to “CHRISTIANIA LUTHERAN CHURCH FOUNDATION” and NOTE on the MEMO/FOR LINE which of the three funds you want your gift directed to. Remember that the uses of the Endowment and Cemetery Funds are very specific. If you want your gift to have more flexibility it should be directed to the Special Purpose Fund.

The Foundation Board is very grateful for the tremendous support of the congregation and from friends of Christiania. With this generosity these funds will be available to support many worthy projects and activities for years to come.

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
