

Easter greetings Christiania family!

We've officially entered the fifty-day Easter season which will culminate in Pentecost. Easter Sunday was glorious both outside and inside the church; it was so great to see so many of you and your families together. This year, I was aware of the energy of the season which I experienced as both enthusiasm and connectedness. I'm pretty sure that energy is a gift of God for us beyond just Easter Sunday. I pray that God energizes us throughout the entire Easter season.

Clearly, the story of Easter as told in the pages of Scripture is of a God who so loves God's people that Jesus is shared. In mutuality, we live as Christ's followers so we can live and grow in love of him and one another. After Christ's death and resurrection, we are entrusted to share the story.

During Lent we worshiped and learned together with our theme, "Living our Baptism." In the familiar gifts spelled out in baptism, we share who God is:

- + to live among God's faithful people;
- + to **hear** the word of God and share in the Lord's Supper;
- + to **proclaim** the good news of God in Christ through word and deed;
- + to **serve** all people, following the example of Jesus;
- + to **strive** for justice and peace in all the earth.

The actions of baptism and the Christian life, it turns out, are also the actions of Easter. In Christ's resurrection we receive new life. In God's amazing miracle we are reconciled to God and God is reconciled to us. We learn to trust God and others.

In the Easter story we are reminded once again of the shortcomings of people. Jesus' ways of living were often confusing to the disciples and continue to be confusing to us. But in our lives—both word and action—we witness to our living God. In Christ's resurrection we see what courageous faith looks like: it looks like proclamation. In the waters of baptism, we are invited to live as risen people.

In this new season of Easter, let us recommit ourselves to God's abundant, grace-filled ways of living. Like the caterpillar's metamorphosis from crawling leaf-eater to flying nectar drinker, let us allow God's spirit to transform and grow us, that our lives become witness to the risen Christ.

I invite you for this fifty-day season to join Christiania family in deep connectedness and intentionality. Together let's live, hear, proclaim, serve, and strive. Let us live as if our Easter proclamation was true: **Christ is risen! He is risen, indeed! Alleluia!**

Seeing the church fill up for the worship service. Watching as our sanctuary transformed from dark to light on Easter morning. The worship service had great music, an engaging sermon and the church was full for many to see and hear it all.

A special thank you to all of the staff and volunteers who spent many hours from Ash Wednesday through Easter Sunday making this meaningful for all of us! - Christiania will have a new automated external defibrillator (A.E.D.). A member has generously offered to buy this life saving device. We are working through Allina Health, they will offer training sessions on how to use it in the near future. Lori Clausen has taken the time to do research on the special project from the start. Thank you.


