




PROPERTY COMMITTEE The Property Committee met on July 12.

- Church Lots For Sale: At their meeting, the Property Committee reviewed aerial photos of the parsonage and farmland lot splits. Discussion was held on making the lots the same size and each was then surveyed at 3.0 acres. The Council hired Jacobson Engineering to survey the lots. This was completed and Bruce Mohn (our reliable man of unlimited talents but limited time) will take the surveyed lots to the August 2 Eureka Planning Committee. Hopefully, he will then go to the August 9 Eureka Town Board for plat approval. The Eureka Board will send the plats to Dakota County for recording. Hopefully, we will have the lots "for sale" by September.
- After the true value of the lots is determined, the lots will be offered for 30 days to the members of our congregation for purchase. This sale would not incur any realtor fees; however, there would be some miscellaneous fees, i.e., recording, etc. If after these 30 days, if either or both lots are still available, they will be listed by Fieldstone RES on MLS at a price to include commission above original price.
- At their June meeting, the Council approved hiring Christiania member Bob Johnson, Fieldstone RES, for a nominal fee to assist with the MLS listing and sale. Thank you, Bob, for your service to your church.
- <u>Progress on Refresh Construction Project</u>: It was determined that there needs to be church oversite of this construction project. The Council appointed Bruce Mohn, Brad Smith and Cheryl Mohn to the Refresh Oversite Committee. They will meet as appropriate and provide updates on the construction progress to the Council.
- Decisions are now being made on the roofing material. Bruce and Brad indicated a need to order materials **NOW** so we don't run into product shortages and shipping delays. We also identified a need to replace windows in the church offices and Sunday School wing if there are any funds remaining in this Refresh project.
- **CEMETERY COMMITTEE** The East and West Cemetery Committees met on July 19. Topics included:
- Stone Repairs at the East Cemetery We are having a difficult time finding a monument company to repair our head stones at the East Cemetery. We will continue to reach out to companies. It was suggested we try mud jacking several of the stones to see if this meets some of our needs. Bruce Mohn will make an area contact. Once we find someone to repair all of our stones, we will have a better handle on the cemetery maintenance funds.
- <u>Well and Hydrants at the West Cemetery</u> After discussion, it was determined that it would be cost prohibitive to install a well at the West Cemetery at this time. We will continue with the tank we have been using and possibly revisit the topic at a future date.
- Kohlnhofer Easement Request The property owners to the north of the West Cemetery requested a 75-foot easement on the east side of our property for an access to their property to the north. The owners received Scott County approval for an entrance off 245th Street and presented this information and a monetary offer to the Cemetery Committee. After lengthy discussion of the pros and cons by the Cemetery Committee members, the members voted unanimously to deny the request. They determined that the offer presented no real benefit to the church, its congregation, or its property. A letter was sent to the owners, signed by the Committee.

General Discussion of Issues

- Discussed if our \$1,500 plot fee for non-members was too low. We seem to be getting more non-member burial requests. Jack will check with two other cemeteries to determine their plot fees for non-members
- Discussion again held on the need for a columbarium. This topic was passed along to the Foundation to pursue.
- Discussed definition of "Associate" member. Many who have once belonged to Christiania consider themselves Associate Members. Future discussion to beheld.
- Discussed various investment opportunities for the funds in our Maintenance Account. It's earning more, where it is sitting in New Market Bank, than anywhere else and we have access to it. More discussion on this after expenses for repairing stones is determined.
- <u>Unseeded Plots</u> It is the family's responsibility to finalize the covering over a grave site. Many times, especially with a non-member burial, this is not done. Jeanne will draft an information sheet containing all the rules for ownership of a plot. When finalized this will be distributed to funeral homes and attached to the receipts for purchase of the grave site.
- <u>Unpaid Reserved Cemetery Plots</u>. The updated Cemetery Plot Fee Policy mandates that reserved cemetery plots be paid by January 1, 2023. The following are the names of people who long ago reserved a plot but did not pay for it. If you have any information on families of these names, please call the office at 952-461-2283.
