March $6^{\text {th }}$ is Ash Wednesday which marks the beginning of Lent. During Lent we are called by God to reflect on the meaning of Christ's death and resurrection. The imposition of ashes-when you receive ashes in the sign of the cross on your that "you are dust and to dust you shall return" (Genesis 3.19b), alongside thortality, that 'you are dust, and to dust you shall return '(Genesis 3.1 which reminds us of the hope of Jesus' death in resurrection

Similarly, in baptism you received the sign of the cross on your forehead. In baptism we are called "to live among God's faithful people, to hear the word of God and share in the Lord's supper, to proclaim the good news of God in Christ through word and deed, to serve all people, following the example of Jesus, and to strive for justice and peace
in all the earth" (ELW pg. 236). In baptism, we describe these responsibilities as faith practices to guide our daily living.
During the season of Lent Sunday worship continues each week at 8:30 \& 10:45 a.m. with a time of fellowship, education, and hospitality in between. Please also join us midweek Wednesday's during Lent at either 11:30 a.m. worship (followed by lunch) or 7:00 p.m. worship (preceded by soup supper) at
$5: 30$ p. . If it hasn't been part of your faith practice, $5: 30$ p.m. If it hasn't been part of your faith practice, consider adding the practice of Wednesday's
during during Lent.
Sunday worship will continue to follow the Revised Common Lectionary while each Wednesday worship (11:30 a.m. and 7:00 p.m.) will focus on our theme: Living Our Baptism. Using baptism and Paul's Letter to the Philippians we'll ask: What do these faith practices mean? and How do we practice them? Our Lent midweek calendar:

Week 1 (Mar 13): Live among God's faithful people
Scripture: Philippians 1:27-30

Week 4 (Apr 3): $\quad$ Serve all people, following the example of Jesus Scripture: Philippians 2:5-11

Week 5 (Apr 10) Strive for justice and peace in all the earth Scripture: Philippians 4:8-9
In Lent we are called to join with God in preparing for Christ's passion, his journey to Easter resurrection through the cross of crucifixion at Holy Week. One of the practices of preparation this year will be preparing young students and their families to receive first communion. I'll be meeting with interested families on Sundays, March 10 \& 17.
