FROM SENIOR PASTOR JON RHODES

In a sermon a few Sundays ago I mentioned four crises that have entered into our cumulative awareness in these past months: health; economic; racial; and political. A friend also mentioned the environment as a similarly important and prevalent crisis. None of these categories is new or unexpected. Friends, we have work to do in important areas we've been putting off. It's time to move forward together and get at these opportunities for grace and wholeness.

There is plenty to be worried about as we navigate life together. People of God, however, aren't to live in fear but, rather, trust of God. Jesus shared how to live in trust—it's love. Scripture affirms, *"There is no fear in love. But perfect love drives out fear, because fear has to do with punishment. The one who fears is not made perfect in love (1 John 4:18)."*

Our God is a God of presence who promises to always be with us. God's presence is one of God's most important and dependable qualities, *"For I am the Lord, your God, who takes hold of your right hand and says to you, Do not fear; I will help you. Do not be afraid, for I myself will help you, declares the Lord, your Redeemer, the Holy One of Israel (Isaiah 41:13-14)."* Jesus Christ, himself, the most visible example of God's promise of presence.

Holy Scripture is full of references to both fear and the antidote to fear: trust and love. The Biblical narrative provides many great examples of how trust and love look. King David was one who trusted and loved God. The context of Psalm 56 includes David being seized by the Philistines, starting to become afraid, and turning toward God in praise and trust: *"When I am afraid, I will trust in you. In God, whose word I praise, in God I trust; I will not be afraid. What can mortal man do to me? (Psalm 56:3-4)."*

The Psalter (book of Psalms) includes many words of trust and love directed toward God in times of fear; four examples:

"When I am afraid, I put my trust in you (Psalm 56:3)."

"Even though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil, for you are with me; your rod and your staff, they comfort me (Psalm 23:4)."

"When anxiety was great within me, your consolation brought joy to my soul (Psalm 94:19)."

"God is our refuge and strength, an ever-present help in trouble (Psalm 46:1)."

It's been a real joy in the past six weeks to baptize four little ones: Jace; Chloe; Sophie; and Andrew. In the sacrament of baptism we are following Christ's command, *"Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age (Matthew 28:19-20)."* As we splash water on foreheads and look into the eyes of children, parents and sponsors I'm not aware of fear but, rather, love, dreams, and hope.

On Reformation Sunday (Oct. 25) we will recognize the completion of confirmation and the entry into adult membership of our church for our 10th graders. They will Affirm the Baptismal promises made on their behalf—and agree to be responsible for their life in Christ. It's a good time for all of us to consider baptism and its role in our Christian life and witness. Here are the words we'll promise:

Do you intend to continue in the covenant God made with you in holy baptism:

live among God's faithful people;

hear the word of God and share in the Lord's Supper;

proclaim the good news of God in Christ through word and deed;

serve all people following the example of Jesus; and

strive for justice and peace in all the earth?"

Response: We do, and ask God to help and guide us.

Members of our church have experienced all types of loss this year and it appears that it may be well into 2021 before things begin to get back to normal. Let's "encourage one another and build one another up" as we listen to and care for one another during these unusual times.

Executive Council Update

The Executive Council met on Tuesday, September 8, 2020. At the meeting, the Council voted to approve the recommended updates to the constitution as outlined by the Constitution Committee. The entire congregation will now have an opportunity to review, discuss and possibly approve these updates at the Annual Meeting. The most notable updates include changing the voting age to confirmed members of any age for any matter and adding the pastor as a voting member of the Executive Council. The Constitution Committee will provide several opportunities for members to review and discuss these proposed updates prior to the Annual meeting. Additional detail is provided in their article in this newsletter.

The Executive Council did not make any change to the COVID- 19 Response Plan at the September meeting and voted to renew a \$70,000 line of credit at the New Market Bank. The Council also discussed the purchase of technology that would allow us to livestream the 9:00 a.m. Sunday service and is checking with both the Property Committee and the team involved in the sanctuary refresh to make sure that this purchase aligns with their plans.

Finally, we are still searching for a new church treasurer. If you feel called to support the church in this way, please let us know.

Executive Council Update

The Executive Council met on Tuesday, September 8, 2020. At the meeting, the Council voted to approve the recommended updates to the constitution as outlined by the Constitution Committee. The entire congregation will now have an opportunity to review, discuss and possibly approve these updates at the Annual Meeting. The most notable updates include changing the voting age to confirmed members of any age for any matter and adding the pastor as a voting member of the Executive Council. The Constitution Committee will provide several opportunities for members to review and discuss these proposed updates prior to the Annual meeting. Additional detail is provided in their article in this newsletter.

The Executive Council did not make any change to the COVID- 19 Response Plan at the September meeting and voted to renew a \$70,000 line of credit at the New Market Bank. The Council also discussed the purchase of technology that would allow us to livestream the 9:00 a.m. Sunday service and is checking with both the Property Committee and the team involved in the sanctuary refresh to make sure that this purchase aligns with their plans.

Finally, we are still searching for a new church treasurer. If you feel called to support the church in this way, please let us know.

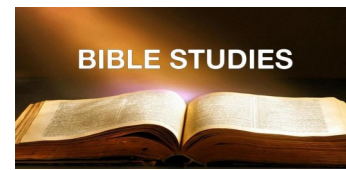

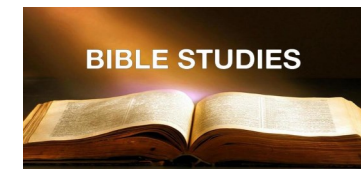

If an Active and Associate Member plot is purchased before January 1, 2021, the total cost for two (2) burials in a plot is capped at \$400

If a Non-Member plot is purchased before January 1, 2021, the total cost for two (2) burials in a plot is capped at \$1,500

A gravestone or marker must be installed within a year of burial.

There is no additional charge for those members who have an existing plot occupied by a spouse prior to January 1, 2017 in one of the cemeteries and a gravestone is installed.

There are many "reserved" plots at both cemeteries. **Reserved plots not paid by January 1, 2023 will be released.**
