A preacher chided, "So who's birthday is it anyway?" The debate between commercialism and the real meaning of Christmas heats up yearly. No exceptions this year. As I write this, the plain red Starbucks cup without Merry Christmas is already seeing "red" from opinionates.

Children challenge parental control as December 25 looms. Case in point, my one year-old grandson scoots up and down the toy truck aisle at Fleet Farm, "Let's ge dhat one...there free in that pack... this one for Chismas." How can you say

Perhaps we need creative ways of saying "yes."

Values are the true gift. What are the values we live by every day that extend to Christmas? Or Christmas values that reach out the rest of the year? How do we say "yes" in a way that demonstrates and supports our Christian values? "Yes" is a powerful word when it affirms our values.

I recall the comment, "don't tell your children that we cannot afford the toy, computer, skates, phone, whatever." Children smell the lie a mile away when the new TV is hung or new car drives up to the house. Instead, discuss family values and goals, how we choose to spend our money. What do we need for living, recreating, transporting, and for the future?" We all cringe at impulse buying because it often turns to buyer's remorse.

The advice pertains to the older children and, frankly, the little ones are easy. My future truck owner was just as excited over the \$4 Tonka Truck as the \$80 truck that sounds sirens and takes up half the living room. Opening packages on Christmas morning outweighs the gift inside for the wee ones!

Steven Covey (author of the "7 Habits of Highly Effective People" books) recommends families develop a mission statement. Cooler heads prevail when thinking about these things in July, than in the excitement of the holidays.

Most of us know that we must budget our limited funds, so what values and goals guide those budgets? Do our children hope to go to college? Do we want to experience God's creation on a yearly vacation? Do we want piano lessons, dance lessons, or to play hockey? Will an iPhone at Christmas serve those goals?

Are we interested in creating a value of generosity (the opposite of selfishness) in our children? That is, more than throwing a buck into the Salvation Army pot. Christmas can be a powerful "yes" when we share values of generosity with our children. The ELCA Good Gifts are a great option. Pick up the printed version at church so your kids can read the stories, understand the people behind the stories, and see the pictures that make them real.

Property Commission Update

Mold Remediation - By the time you receive this, we should have Christiania locked up dry for the winter. We filled in holes around the foundation: we removed the patio and graded that area; and we installed extensions to the downspouts to get the water away from the church.

Next spring during our "Spring Clean Up," we will be landscaping the east and north sides of our church. We obtained rock that matches the rock on the south side of the church. We will be looking for volunteers early next May – stay tuned. We've asked the Executive Council to think about their "vision" for the back yard over the winter. Please share your thoughts also.

Roof Replacement / Maintenance - After our shocking bid for replacement of the existing flat roof, the church contracted with Building Envelope Consultants to do a total assessment of the roof – what needs to be done immediately: what can be scheduled out into future years. The report indicated that the entire flat roof needs repairs and the section over the Fellowship Hall needs replacement in 2016. We sent a request to Council asking for permission to get bids on this before winter. David Frame is helping with this. He noted areas of immediate concern on the roof and sealed those parsonage. There was more junk and trash than we areas. We would not have any worries over winter. What a valuable asset for Christiania. Thank you, David!

Project List – An updated project list was sent to the November Council meeting for their review. We took a Anderson or Warren Peterson. hard look at what projects should be considered repairs and maintenance. In this category is landscaping, replacing the church telephone system, outside masonry

needs, repair of stain glass window frames, painting of the bell tower, update of the alarm system and miscellaneous repairs.

We created a "Future Capital Improvements Project" list that captures our larger needs – the parking lot repair or replacement, the roof repair or replacement, landscaping in the back yard, and the refinishing of the floors in the education wing and youth room. This year, with our limited funds and time, we are concentrating on the acoustic panels in the Fellowship Hall. These panels will be installed in the spring.

<u>Twin Church Ball Field</u> – Steve Anderson and his family have moved the ballfield faithfully for many years. 2015 was their last year. We are looking for other members that would like to take on this service to their church. The Children, Youth and Family Leader has plans for using this next year.

Pew Replacement with Chairs – This is still on hold until we realize the financial impact of the mold remediation issue.

Parsonage Update - Cleaning continues around the realized. It looks so good!! Thank you to Steve Fredrickson for repairing the parsonage garage doors.
