We can expect more adjustments will be needed in the weeks ahead. In fact, we've been practicing adjustments, grace, and flexibility during the Refresh Project's first six to eight weeks. Josh Carlson, our General Contractor, continues to move the project along at a rapid pace and we look forward to enjoying Christiania's Sanctuary for years to come.

We encourage all to follow along with us with grace and flexibility. In the weeks to come keep showing up at worship, follow our website, read our weekly E-news and monthly newsletter.

In our text box we read: "We boast in our afflictions..." These words from the Apostle Paul's Letter to the Romans seem confusing at best. Boasting in our afflictions? Afflictions are the very things we're all trying to avoid, yet we should boast about them? It's almost impossible to imagine boasting about the very things we're all trying to avoid. And perhaps that's the problem, that the energy of our daily lives can be focused on protecting ourselves, keeping safe, and avoiding anything that might afflict us.

The list of things that afflict us is almost endless: hunger, homelessness, cancer, unemployment, addiction—even being unfriended on social media. All these bring us to what's really unfathomable: brokenness, loneliness, isolation, and shame.

Therefore, since we are justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have obtained access to this grace in which we stand, and we boast in our hope of sharing the glory of God. And not only that, but we also boast in our afflictions, knowing that affliction produces endurance, and endurance produces character, and character produces hope, and hope does not put us to shame, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us.

Romans 5:1-5

These are all true concerns for any living on earth and these are all concerns of the Earthly Kingdom.

But, as people of faith, who have transitioned from Good Friday (Earthly Kingdom) to Easter (God's Kingdom), we are keenly aware of the suffering presented in affliction. Afflictions bring changes in perspective and, more importantly, changes in expectations. Affliction provides opportunity for growth. Affliction allows us to stop focusing on avoiding trouble and know God will use trouble to help us become more trusting of Him and more mature. Without all of our energy focused on avoiding affliction and suffering we are freed to fully live. Christ's death is for us. In God's Kingdom that which afflicts us doesn't wipe us out, defeat us, or bring us to death.

But boasting in our afflictions, Paul reminds us, serves a higher purpose: "...affliction produces endurance, and endurance produces character, and character produces hope..." Affliction produces endurance, endurance brings character, character brings hope. Of course, we boast in our afflictions because they ultimately bring about hope.

Our afflictions become markers of our identity. Each of our scars tells a story and helps us lean into what's really truly important. Afflictions don't bring the end—they bring the beginning. God walks alongside us and never leaves us alone. In affliction we lean into endurance which brings character, which brings hope. Friends, God loves you wholeheartedly—especially the broken parts.

God loves you and so do I! Pastor Jon



SANCTUARY REFRESH UPDATE



Construction

Once again, the workers have been busy, moving the progress of the Refresh Project ahead. Some of the things that they have accomplished inside since demolition are: moving the door opening for the sacristy, framing the front wall for the AV screen and the stone, framing the interior soffit faces that used to be blue, framing the altar platform and preparing the front and back walls for insulation amongst other things!

Outside they have removed the siding on the front and back walls as well as the facia under the soffits. The HVAC units and ductwork have been removed and the roof is patched where the vents used to be. The new HVAC units and ductwork have been installed and the roof insulation and shingles are in the process of being installed currently!

Funding

Those of you that have pledged to the project this year, just a reminder to fulfill your pledges as you are able because the money for this project has started to go out. A huge thank you to those of you that have contributed to the project making this possible. The project is not fully funded and more donations are welcome! Other Capital Projects

Property committee members met with Josh Carlson, the contractor, to discuss plans for an ADA compliant bathroom with the hope of getting it accomplished during the construction of the sanctuary and while worship is at the New Market Town Hall during August and September. The plan is to use some of the money from the sale of the ballpark property to cover the cost of the bathroom. There are other projects on the wish list for the property committee, but some of them can wait and do not need to be done during the Refresh Project.



Children, Youth, & Family

Children, Youth and Family Staffing Update and Listening Sessions

Over the past six months, several members from Christiania have been part of a Discovery Team led by Nick Clark from InterServe Ministries. The purpose of this team was to discern and dream about the next chapter in our Children, Youth and Family (CYF) Ministry. After some prayerful exploration and information gathering from the congregation, they are ready to present a proposal for future staffing.

The team is proposing that Christiania move forward to call a Deacon. In the ELCA, Deacons are considered ministers of **word and service** whereas pastors are ministers of **word and sacrament**. They both serve collaboratively, side by side and are called through the Saint Paul Area Synod. The team is excited to present their proposal for a new innovative leader to join the Christiania family.

This new position will be important in the life of the entire congregation, not just children and youth. The CYF Discovery team will be holding listening sessions for the congregation where they will present their proposal, allowing for questions and feedback. The meetings will be focused on the following areas:

- The process, findings, and recommendations
- What is a deacon and why this may be a good fit for Christiania?
- How easy is it to find a Deacon in our synod?
- The core competencies desired in this position
- Christiania Budget impacts

The dates of these listening sessions are **July 9th**, and **July 23rd**. These sessions will be held following the 9:00 AM worship service. Online Zoom options will be available as well.

"Since this is a synodical call, our constitution states that the congregation will need to vote by at least a two-thirds majority to make the call. On **SUNDAY AUGUST 6**, **2023**, there will be a special congregational meeting and vote right after worship. Please mark your calendars and plan to attend this important vote and one of the listening sessions!
