A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR JON

*“I...beg you to lead a life worthy of the calling to which you have been called, with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another in love, making every effort to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace.” (Ephesians 4:1-3)*

God is love. From the very beginning of creation, God’s actions in creating this amazing world and everything in it show God’s great capacity for love. In the provision and gift to this world of God’s son, Jesus Christ, God shows his commitment to love (remember John 3:16 *For God so loved the world...*).

In the ministry and life of Christ and in his death and resurrection we see God’s commitment to love. The gospel of Matthew (22:37-40) shares Jesus’ staking everything on love; we call it the great commandment: *“Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind.’ This is the first and greatest commandment. And the second is like it: ‘Love your neighbor as yourself.’ All the Law and the Prophets hang on these two commandments.”*

Love God. Love People. Everything, my friends, is about loving God and loving people. How are you doing in loving God and loving people? I’ll have to admit, at times I come up short in loving both God and people. Regarding God: at times I’m really aware of God and how important it is to be connected to God in prayer and worship; other times I’m distracted and less than diligent about conversing with God and making sure he knows how much I love him. Regarding people: I’m often aware of them and cognizant of their needs; other times I’m clueless; still other times I find myself outright dismissing the other.

The Apostle Paul in one of his letters to the Corinthians suggests that nothing else but love matters. Paraphrasing the first three verses of 1 Corinthians 13, Paul suggests that without love words mean nothing, without love actions mean nothing, and without love nothing can be gained: *“If I speak in the tongues of mortals and of angels, but do not have love, I am a noisy gong or a clanging cymbal. And if I have prophetic powers, and understand all mysteries and all knowledge, and if I have all faith, so as to remove mountains, but do not have love, I am nothing. If I give away all my possessions, and if I hand over my body so that I may boast, but do not have love, I gain nothing.”*

Paul leads us toward God’s complete, agape love as he explains what love is, what it is not, what love does, and what love does not do: *“Love is patient; love is kind; love is not envious or boastful or arrogant or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; it does not rejoice in wrongdoing, but rejoices in the truth. It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things.”* (1 Corinthians 13:4-7)

To paraphrase:  
**Love is not:** envious; boastful; arrogant; rude; irritable or resentful.  
**Love does not:** insist on its own way; or rejoice in wrongdoing.

**Love is:** patient; and kind.  
**What love does:** rejoices in the truth; bears all things; believes all things; hopes all things; and endures all things.

Curious, some of those things love does—I do not. Some of those things love doesn’t do—I do. Am I really following Christ’s command to love God and love people if I come up so short in very visible ways? Truth be told, when I’m not patient or not kind I’m unable to share God’s love with the world. I know this because when someone’s impatient with me it feels like they’re angry - - not loving. Same with these less than positive traits (envious, boastful, arrogant, rude, irritable or resentful) none of them help me know the other loves me. In them we cannot show God’s love. In my hurts and wounds I often lash out at others in less than loving ways. My own emotions so easily prevent me from what I would say is most important to me: loving God and loving people.

I’m challenged by how insisting on my own way is not loving. In the past years I’ve been really working hard to listen to others (especially those I disagree with) to better understand their point of view. I’ve been working hard to be more accepting of positions and ideas that are different than my own positions and ideas. To hear and to really deeply listen to the other is to risk being changed by them—an action of loving them. Recognizing my own shortcomings has also helped me recognize how much I need others. 1 Corinthians 13 shows how Christ-like love is powerful and special. This kind of love assumes no wrong, accepts imperfections (both ours and others), and forgives over and over again.

As challenging as the past six months have been, one of the great joys has been seeing the fullness of faith and trust in the body of Christ. Despite a diversity of beliefs and ideas, our leadership team is constantly exhibiting the “give and take” of mutuality and relationship. We come together, share our many ideas, then compromise on a plan to move forward. This is clearly an act of love. In Christ there is no division ( *...no Greek nor Jew...no slave nor free...no man nor woman...*). It doesn’t mean we don’t disagree but it does mean we move together.

Loving others is challenging. Being mutual in relationship is tough. The golden rule isn’t “love others because they love you,” rather, “ *In everything do to others as you would have them do to you.*” (Matthew 7:12) Treat each other as you want to be treated. I want others to assume the best about me and my intentions. Why wouldn’t I afford others the same opportunity? Why would I be so reluctant to share grace with others? When the world revolves around me and my feelings/ideas/intentions/ ways it doesn’t allow me/us to revolve around God—we just revolve around ourselves.

God is love. Join me this month in focusing on how our words and actions exhibit God’s love - - or not. I challenge you to catch yourself when you jump to conclusions about the other or make assumptions about their intentions. Please know I’ll be working to catch myself. I’ll also be praying and working toward self-discipline to interpret and understand the other in the best possible light. Praying that my words and actions will be seen as God’s love in the world.

God loves you and so do !! Pastor Jon

## A MESSAGE FROM ROB METZ - COUNCIL PRESIDENT

The Executive Council met on Tuesday, July 14, 2020. The Council met in person at the church for the first time since February. At the July 14 meeting, the Council heard a presentation from the committee that has been studying possible revisions to the church constitution. Council members will discuss these suggested changes at their August Executive Council meeting. The Executive Council also voted to make a slight change to the COVID-19 Response Plan. This change allowed for adjustments to be made in the process for safely entering the church building.

I am writing this message after returning from our first in-building, socially distanced, Sunday worship service. It was great to be back in church on a Sunday morning. As I was driving home, I was thinking of the members of the Executive Council and how much I appreciate them. I remember when I asked some of them to join the Council this year. I told them that they would only have one meeting per month. Ha! I was a little off on that one. Then I realized that God was planning the steps, not me. Each of these folks ended up on the Executive Council for a reason. I am going to pray that God will continue to "establish the steps" for the rest of us to take as we work together to gradually and safely reopen the church during the COVID-19 pandemic.

### Here's how the Red Cross is keeping donors safe:

The top priority of the Red Cross is the safety of our donors, volunteers, employees and blood recipients, and we are committed to transparency with the American public during this evolving public health emergency. There are no data or evidence that this coronavirus can be transmissible by blood transfusion, and there have been no reported cases worldwide of transmissions for any respiratory virus including this coronavirus.

Donating blood products is essential to community health and eligible donors are strongly urged to donate [blood](#), [platelets](#), or [AB Elite plasma](#). The Red Cross only collects blood from individuals who are healthy and feeling well at the time of donation – and who meet other [eligibility requirements](#).

At each blood drive or donation center, Red Cross employees follow thorough safety protocols, including:

- Wearing gloves and changing them often
- Wiping down donor-touched areas after every collection
- Using sterile collection sets for every donation
- Preparing the arm for donation with aseptic scrub
- Conducting donor mini-physicals to ensure donors are healthy and well on day of donation

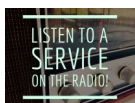


## INDOOR AND OUTDOOR WORSHIP

We had our first indoor service on July 19 and will continue them during August! The service lasts approximately 30 minutes and reservations are strongly encouraged since seating is limited due to social distancing. There is a quick, hands-free check-in to verify everyone entering the building is symptom free to the best of their knowledge, and to make sure we have your phone number in case we need to give you a courtesy call if someone in attendance indicates they tested positive for Covid at a later date. If you want to make a reservation, please visit our website or contact Carri in the office. Christiania's guidelines for indoor gatherings are available on our website along with a welcome video that will let you know what to expect when you arrive. Masks are required as long as the state mandate is in effect. If you want to listen to the indoor services but do not wish to enter the building, the services will be broadcast live by radio in our parking lot. Simply park anywhere in the lot and tune your radio to 87.9 FM.

We will also offer periodic outdoor services in addition to the indoor services and online services. The first outdoor service is Sunday, August 9 at 6:00 p.m. Feel free to bring lawn chairs to sit near the worship area (observing social distance). There will be plenty of shade at this time of day. You can also remain in your vehicle and listen to the service by radio (87.9 FM). More dates/times for outdoor services will be announced at a later time.

Our online services will continue to be offered for those who prefer to continue worshipping at home. Thank you to all committee members and staff who have spent countless hours making all of this possible. We look forward to seeing you Sundays, whether online or in person.

Our Sunday Worship services are broadcast by radio in our parking lot! To listen, simply stop in our parking lot anytime and tune your radio to 87.9 FM. The 9:00 a.m. indoor services are broadcast live each Sunday. Each 10:00 a.m. online service will be rebroadcast for one week, Sunday through Saturday, beginning at the top of every hour. Please help spread the word to family and friends who lack access to the internet and might be looking for ways to connect and worship.

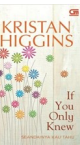
