Christiania Friends,

Thank you to all who have prayed for, supported, questioned, worked on, and contributed to our Sanctuary Refresh Project and Revive Campaign; on Sunday, May 15 we announced surpassing the \$800,000 mark in commitments and donations. There is still time to include your intentions and gifts as we continue to move forward in our planning, preparation, and anticipation.

Next steps include an upcoming congregational meeting after worship on Sunday, June 12 when we will gather in person and online (preregistration is only required for those attending the meeting online). On June 12 members of Christiania will vote on two items: whether to approve the project and whether we should sell property and parsonage. In preparation for our gathering, please continue to pray about this project and God’s plans for Christiania.

Also, we’re in the early stages of planning for a return to Friendly Visitors. Over the years, many of you have committed yourselves to loving another by regularly reaching out via visits and phone calls as a part of this ministry. The pandemic has created some challenges for visits and contact but this appears to be an opportune time to reengage our Friendly Visitor team. Let us know if you are interested in serving in this important ministry or if you would be open to having regular visits from a Friendly Visitor.

What a special time of year this is as temps are finally warming and everything is greening up. It’s so amazing to see the trees and flowers budding. And, as is often the case, I’m surprised how busy things are. I am feeling stretched. Perhaps you’re feeling stretched too? Have you been carrying too many commitments and responsibilities? Is your calendar full? Do you have too little time to yourself?

To be a follower of Christ means to be people of peace. This means being people who live in such trust of God that we live in Christ’s peace. In scripture Jesus reminds us the path to peace begins in relationship: “Come to me,” he invites. The path to peace in our world and in our lives is through Jesus and in Jesus we find rest.

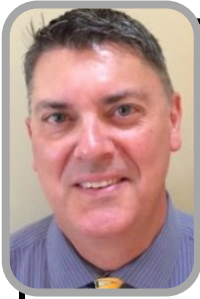

## Bill Kanfield - Christiania Council President

Once again, a lot going on around CLC to report on, and even more to be amazed about. Another congregation special meeting has been called for June 12 after service. This session will be to discuss and vote on authorizing the Refresh Project based on the fantastic level of contributions and pledges. It has just been a blessing to see the funds rise on the project meter! We will also vote to formally authorize proceeding with the sale of non-farmable lands including the Parsonage and another homestead parcel. Bruce Mohn and team will lead an information session on June 5 to understand all this entails in advance of a vote. Hopefully, this combination will mean we do not need to use our Line of Credit or take out a loan, but there is a team (Bruce Mohn, Robin Martin and Warren Peterson) exploring fiscally responsible options should we need to.

While the property refresh planning and funding moves forward, mission, ministry and outreach is also continuing to explore. There are some great ideas coming out of Evangelism (Andrew Mendez and Tia Burnham) on different ways to think about evangelism and the relationships we build and even thoughts on ways to assess the congregation to better focus on growing mission, ministry and outreach. The different teams, committees and boards are meeting again on June 23 to continue collaborative goal setting.

Finally, the soft side of change – staffing. We should be nearing resolution to the Treasurer position, with Lisa Schultze either returning from a leave of absence or confirming this role is no longer a good fit; in this case the Personnel committee will advance the hiring of a Treasurer. A huge shout out to the Financial Review Committee (Cheryl Schindeldecker, Cheryl Bahnsen, Tia Burnham, Denise Kanfield and Karen Frame) for picking up the slack and getting us back on track from a financial reporting perspective!

As Joe Jorgensen continues his journey through seminary, we have some good news and not so good news: As part of his Clinical Pastoral Education summer internship, Joe will be providing an additional level of ministry and outreach with CLC. The not so good news is beginning January 2023, Joe will embark on a year-long internship elsewhere, bringing on role discussions around CYF leader and assisting minister. In the meantime, please ask Joe about his summer CPE internship!

## PROPERTY COMMITTEE –

Did you notice the improved look at our south door? The old bench was refurbished by Cody Wubben. We have many members that just step in where they see a need.

Thank you, Cody

Flowers outside the south and front entrance doors as well as around the sign on Pillsbury will need to be watered. Please consider signing up to assist with this need.

Parsonage Update – The well at the Parsonage was losing pressure due to a hole in the pipe. Jaekels Well Service replaced the pump, pipe, and the pressure tank. Last year we replaced the pump controller.

The Property Committee met on 4/12 and discussed the church farm and the possibility of lot splits for our parsonage and the wooded area to the west of the parsonage.

Property requested multiple estimates and received two estimates for pest control at our church. We have ants and rodents we have selected Terminix for this service period.

Property was asked to create a Key Control policy. If you have a key that was given to you by a prior Mission or Council member, please let the office know so we can know where they are. There are several keys missing.

**CEMETERY COMMITTEE** - The East and West Cemetery Committees met on April 5. Topics included:

Stone Repairs at the East Cemetery. We are having a difficult time finding a company to repair our head stones at the East Cemetery. We will again reach out to monument companies after Memorial Day.

East Cemetery - At the East Cemetery, John Mohn continues to cut shrubs and mow the areas not mowed by our mowing company. Again, a member stepping up to help his church. Thank you, John!!!

Well at the West Cemetery – For years, Don Storlie and Jason Estrem have been hauling large tanks of water to the Cemetery for plant watering purposes. Discussion was held on whether to continue this practice or put in a well and hydrants. Bruce Lundeen will get bids for well drilling, hydrant placements, piping and electrical. The committees will meet again to decide whether to move forward with this. Don Storlie indicated we use approximately 600 gallons of water a year at this cemetery.

Parking at the West Cemetery – Discussion was held on the loss of parking spaces for the cemetery since the right turn lane was installed for the new development on the south side of the road. Discussions will continue at the next meeting.

Kohlhofer Easement Request – The property owners to the North of the West Cemetery requested an easement on the east side of our property for an access to their property. Since this requires an access onto a County Road, we asked that they contact the County first to see if they would allow a driveway onto a County Road at this location.

Unpaid Reserved Cemetery Plots. The updated Cemetery Plot Fee policy mandates that reserved cemetery plots be paid by January 1, 2023. Both Lundeens (West Cemetery) and Eckdahls (East Cemetery) have lists of unpaid reserved plots. Once they have contacted known families, we will publish a list of un-paid reserved plot names in the newsletter hoping that someone will recognize a name and can assist locating them.

Need New Members - We need to recruit young members to assist in these cemetery committees. It's a gratifying position but it does take time. Please consider. Contact the Lundeens or Eckdahls if you wish to join. Membership is FREE!!

# CHRISTIANIA REFRESH AND REVIVE



## Refresh Project Update

We are well on our way.....but we still have a ways to go.

We are so grateful that an additional \$12,600 has been pledged since Commitment Sunday bringing our total in donations and Commitments to just over \$819,000.00. Thank you for your generous support. It is never too late to submit your pledge. Pledges may be placed in the offering plates or sent to the church office. Check out the Giving Chart in the Fellowship Hall to see our progress toward our goal.

If this is not a good time for your financial support please know that your prayers are an important gift as well.

### Two important upcoming dates:

**June 5** - There will be a presentation in the fellowship hall during coffee regarding the proposal to sell two parcels of non-farmable property. This will also provide a time for additional questions and answers regarding the Refresh Project.

**June 12** - Congregational Meeting (following the church service) to vote to proceed with the Refresh Project. There will be a second vote to proceed with the sale of two pieces of church property. More specific information on these votes is in this newsletter (see pages 1, 3, and 11).

The proceeds from the sale of the property would be used for any shortfall in the funds necessary to complete the Refresh Project. Any excess funds will be placed in a capital expenditure fund for future building needs.



The Congregation Council passed a motion May 10 authorizing a Congregation Special Meeting to vote on the Refresh Project as presented by the Refresh team and associated funding measures.

This Special Meeting and vote by ballot will be held at 10 AM (after service) on Sunday, June 12. (In person or via Zoom.)

The Council feels there has been sufficient time for the Refresh team to present the project design, details and cost estimates, the Revive Capital Campaign team to gather contributions, pledges and donations, and the Property team to research and present findings related to the sale of church property (to be presented June 5 at 10 AM) as additional Revive Capital Campaign contributions.

If you cannot attend in-person, please register to attend and vote remotely via Zoom by emailing Carri at [office@christianialutheranchurch.org](mailto:office@christianialutheranchurch.org). You will be sent instructions and the Zoom link in advance of the meeting. Please note that all remote attendees will voice their vote individually to a member of the Council who will convert their voice vote to a paper ballot to be counted with the rest of the congregation.

All online attendees must register in advance of the special meeting no later than **Sunday June 5th**.

Below are the two DRAFT resolutions to be voted on by paper ballot on Sunday June 12; any additional new information received by the team before June 12 may adjust the language slightly, but not the concepts:

#### **D R A F T   RESOLUTION 2022-2 TO AUTHORIZE “REFRESH” PROJECT**

Whereas the congregation of Christiania Lutheran Church authorized a Revive Capital Campaign, and

Whereas a Revive Capital Campaign has raised over \$800,000 in pledges, donations and contributions toward the Refresh Project, and

Whereas the Refresh team has presented and discussed the option details and associated costs of the Refresh Project through paper and electronic communications, in-person listening sessions, in-service temple talks, suggestion box input, a video, and a table with samples and artistic renditions,

Therefore be it resolved that Christiania Lutheran Church authorizes the Refresh team to proceed with final design, contracting and construction work necessary to fulfill the terms of the Treasured Spaces Project Estimate as presented to the congregation, until there shall be reviews of the status by the Property Committee and the Congregation Council that the Refresh Project is complete.

#### **D R A F T   RESOLUTION 2022-3 TO AUTHORIZE SALE OF CHURCH PROPERTY**

Whereas the congregation of Christiania Lutheran Church authorized the Refresh Project, and

Whereas a Revive Capital Campaign has raised funding to within \$400,000 of the requested amount based on the Treasured Spaces Project Estimate, and

Whereas a Property Committee has communicated the process and proposal to support the Revive Capital Campaign with additional capital through the sale of two (2) parcels of Christiania non-farmable land,

Therefore be it resolved that Christiania Lutheran Church authorizes the Property Committee to proceed with the sale of the property of Lot 1 – The Parsonage (approximately 2.6 acres) AND Lot 2 – The Ballfield (approximately 3.55 acres), with the proceeds designated to the Revive Capital Campaign.
